#### Chamber board endorses DCS levy

At its June meeting, the Chamber board of directors voted to endorse a 5-year 8.35 mil emergency levy that the **Delaware City Schools** is forced to put on the November ballot. This levy request comes six years after the last new operating levy was passed. At that time, that levy was expected to last three years. The November levy is vital because, at current funding from the state, the district will see an \$18 million deficit in the 2020/21 academic year.

SET OF SEE

Because of a funding cap enacted during the recession, those districts that grew during that time are not receiving the funds per pupil from the state that is required. Lifting the cap would mean that all districts receive the per-pupil funding they are entitled to. Asking local taxpayers to cover for what the state legislature rightfully owes those growth-districts should not be necessary, but Delaware City Schools and their teachers, support staff and most especially the students should not be abandoned by the residents of this amazing district at the local level as it has been at the state level. Because the state sees fit to hold tax payers responsible for school funding in districts that grew in a down economy (ironically, in large part to the excellence of the schools) DCS has no choice but to put the issue on the ballot and the Chamber asks the support of those voters in the district.

The district has demonstrated a commitment to controlling costs as evidenced by their low per pupil spending. DCS spends \$9,733 per pupil as compared to the state average of \$11,162 and a central Ohio average of nearly \$12,000. Without additional revenue, DCS would be forced to cut spending by an additional \$1000 per student – cuts that would negatively impact the quality of education through reduced academic and extra-curricular offerings and larger class sizes.

The Chamber also encourages voters to contact their representatives in Columbus. The chair of the House committee on education is Representative Andy Brenner: 740-602-5033.

# **Enrollment Underway for Workers' Comp Premium Discount Programs**

Did your organization complete a Temporary Authorization to Review Information (AC-3) form earlier this spring as part of our workers' compensation member benefit?

If so, your organization should now be in receipt of your savings analysis from our program administrator, <u>CompManagement</u>, as long as your company was found to be eligible to participate in a premium discount program for the upcoming 2018 policy year.

#### Chamber's event cancellation policy

From time-to-time the Chamber has to cancel a planned event. Sometimes it's because the presenter has an un expected emergency, but usually it's because low registration doesn't justify asking a volunteer speaker to travel and for caterers to cook and set up a room for only a handful of attendees.

In those cases, we notify via email those who have registered for the event. Those who have not registered and show up at the venue will be inconvenienced and we apologize. Although we expect walk-ins at the event, we cannot predict how many there will be so we can't include that unknown number in our decision to hold or cancel an event. Often, had we known the number of unregistered walk-ins will attend, we would not have had to cancel the event.

Please understand that holding events is planned around knowing who commits to attending. Often walk-ins impact the room set-up and the amount of food prepared. While we don't discourage walk-ins, we have no way of contacting them. If you find at the last minute that you can attend an event, call the Chamber the day before or the morning of the event to make sure your trip isn't wasted.

funding formula shows they should be receiving and Delaware City is losing around \$7 MILLION of funding per year. Local tax-payers, and our students, pay the price for those withheld funds.

Again, all the districts and our career center make us proud by exceeding state and federal statistics in every area from ACT scores to graduation rates. Every one of the Delaware County school districts performs well above the state average and based on student performance the county is number one out of Ohio's 88 counties when it comes to preK-12 education!

While leading the state in student performance, every district in the county spends well below the state and national average per pupil. This combination of high performance and low spending make our county's schools the best value by far in Ohio!

Construction is in various phases in each of the districts and at the career center as the districts deal with aging buildings and growing enrollments. Big Walnut and Delaware City both have vital levies on the November ballot to allow them to deal with these realities.

There is no more important infrastructure than local education. That the diverse districts in Delaware County continue to produce the quality of students that they do while being shortchanged financially by a legislature that is responsible for funding public schools fairly, adequately and legally and by the moving targets of progress scoring systems that take a 32-page document to understand continue to amaze.
