Leadership Delaware Class of 2024 Agriculture Day

Leadership Delaware Class of 2024 met at the Byxbe Campus on Thursday, November 9th, 2023. The day began with breakfast and a round of speed dating. This was followed by an introduction from the facilitators, Teresa Watkins and Kenzie Johnston, and an overview of Delaware County agriculture by Jacci Smith, Ohio State Extension Office. She hosted a fast-paced round of Jeopardy to see what we already knew or didn't know about agriculture.

Next, we were introduced to a panel of six successful Delaware County agricultural producers (Bret Davis, Gary Davis, Doug Dawson, Tim Harsh, Earl Lehner and Ryan Rhodes) with discussion led by Jacci Smith. They discussed the

issues and challenges, as well as technological advances that they face in agriculture today. Some of the issues they face are increased demand for land development, difficulties in finding labor to help farm and restrictions and regulations that are in place. They also discussed technological advances which have been an asset to their production. The cell phone and tablet provides them with the amount of moisture, how seeds are dropped and logs the amount of fertilizer needed and used. Also discussed were the benefits of generational farming and the importance of succession planning.

Our first stop of the day was Cackler Farms Trees & Greenery. They are family owned and operated, since 1989. They have around 29,000 trees, with several varieties to choose from. It takes anywhere from 5-10 years for the trees to become of mature height and their staff begin shaping the trees in late June. They do require that families go online, or call to make a reservation. They

also make and sell custom evergreen wreaths in various shapes and sizes.

A luncheon of pork tenderloin, cheesy potatoes and salad was provided by The Pork Man, and complimented by apple and pumpkin pie from The Pie Lady. Following lunch, the day's tour resumed with a stop at **Price Farm Organics**. Price Farm Organics is an EPA certified Class II commercial composting facility and a family business operated by 3 generations. This means they are approved to take a wide variety of organic materials for composting. They are not what one would think with organic vegetables, but the operation is all about the soil inputs and how to make it organically nutrient rich for farmers, commercial and residential use. There are various recipes for different organic materials to produce the best agricultural and gardening additives. We were guided through the







property on the bus with Tom Price and the team explaining the operation. One major partnership they have is with the Columbus Zoo and their sustainability effort to produce the famous Zoo Brew which uses 2.9 million pounds of manure from the cages of wild animals to make a nutrient dense product to grow the best gardens. Price Farms has received a USDA grant to provide compost to school systems and urban organizations to locally grow gardens and education about soil health and gardening. Food waste in America is another initiative, Price Farms partners with Ohio State University to combat waste. OSU has a zero-waste goal and all the food scraps from OSU go to Price Farms where they compost it to produce more nutrient dense materials. Price Farms has several EPA licenses to manage and turn by-products into usable materials to benefit our community.



The tour continued to HFS Farm, a Certified Angus farm owned and operated by Tim and Elizabeth Harsh, near Radnor. Elizabeth introduced the group to their herd of Angus cows used to raise certified Angus heifers to sell as breeding stock all across the country. She highlighted how they use genetic testing to determine the best quality genetics when breeding their cows. Some qualities they select for are the mothering ability of the cows and the marbling and taste of the meat product when offspring are harvested. The farm uses modern technology to monitor the cows with ear tags. Sensors in the ear tags can identify the optimum time for breeding each cow as well as if a particular cow is not well and needs veterinary care. The herd roams rolling fields of grass forage with supplements from bales of hay through the winter. Elizabeth shared that cattle farms are less prominent in Delaware County in comparison to other areas. This can be contributed to the land use being better suited to row crops, whereas rugged terrain, such as that in Eastern Ohio, is more suitable for grazing animals.

Our fourth stop was Gallant Farm of <u>Preservation Parks of Delaware</u> <u>County</u> in Troy Township. When we stepped off the bus, the aroma and atmosphere of farms were immediately experienced. Here we met with Molly Creamer, the Farm Manager, who eagerly explained that Gallant Farm repre-

sents the Depression-era farm lifestyle. The 19-acre farm is operated the same way farms were operated in the 1930s and 1940s. There is a machine shed where all the tools and implements are stored that would have been required for this time period. There are crop fields that the staff farm by plowing, planting, and harvesting all with period type equipment. They produce their own hav that is used for the few farm animals that are raised on the farm. We learned how the hay is put up in the barn loft and not bundled like it is today. Also on the property is a farmhouse that is filled with period furnishings donated by numerous different members of our community. You can wander through the farmhouse, sit on the furniture, and often see baking and cooking in ways that would have been done back in the day. There was no running water so the wood burning stove that was used to cook and heat the home, and





heat water was demonstrated. That on its own is an aroma that takes you back in time. Programs that are held at the farm are to educate the community on how things were on the farm before modernization. Programs include antique tractor shows, winter evenings on the farm, how to preserve produce from the garden, make sausage, making soup and pies with the wood burning stove, and so many others.

Our last stop of the day was to <u>Hardscrabble</u> <u>Farms</u>, owned and operated by the Skinner Family. They discussed technological advances and the benefits of generational farming with three generations hosting the group. Brian Skinner shared that once the crops are harvested, they begin planning for the next season. They collect soil samples and use technology to map out where the samples were collected. The samples are sent to a lab for testing. Using the results of the lab



tests, they are able to fertilize their fields specific to the needs of each zone, reducing waste and run-off. Darren Skinner shared they also spray the fields in the fall for weeds to reduce nuisance plants from growing in the spring and summer They also explained how newer tractors with tracks, instead of tires, aid in better management practices. When you ride on tracks, the weight of the equipment is distributed over a wider area which results in less soil compaction. Members were encouraged to look at and climb inside the tractors to experience and imagine what it would be like to farm.






